
Brazos Water Snake



- Scientific Name: Nerodia harteri harteri
- Endemic to the Brazos Basin
- Non-venomous
- Mostly aquatic, stream and reservoir beds and banks
- Feeds on small fish, salamanders, frogs, and crayfish
- Lack of life history knowledge



Known Range



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State Threatened

- Listed in 1986 no conservation actions to date
- Population in decline
- Threats
 - Dams
 - Siltation
 - Hydrologic change
 - Salt Cedar





TPWD Conservation Plan Development

- Goal of Plan
 - Identify beneficial conservation measures
 - Avert need for intervention by the federal government
- Asked BRA to partner
- Held planning meeting in February 2021
- Relying on best available data





Proposed Study

- Supports Strategic Plan Goal 3(b)
- Anticipated 3-years duration
- Topics
 - Species distribution
 - Occupancy, abundance, and habitat associations
 - Age structure and habitat
 - Movement
 - Reproductive ecology
- Statistically valid data





Contract

- 3-year term
- Not to exceed \$750,000
- RFP one response from Bio West, Inc.
 - In business since 1976
 - Specializes in species related issues and permitting
 - Extensive experience with aquatic species and reptiles, and specifically with the Brazos Water Snake
