Brief Introduction: The City of Waco manages the treatment and distribution of water from Lake Waco for the city and several smaller surrounding communities. The City of Waco's Water Utilities Department delivers an average of 28 million gallons of water daily to people in the Central Texas area.

The City of Waco has invested considerable time and resources to protecting the region's water supply and is committed to finding a long-term solution.
