

AGENCY PRESENCE IN THE NORTH BOSQUE RIVER WATERSHED

Brief Introduction: The Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) was created in 1957. It currently provides loans to local governments for water supply projects; water quality projects including wastewater treatment, municipal solid waste management and nonpoint source pollution control; flood control projects; agricultural water conservation projects; and groundwater district creation expenses. TWDB also provides grants and loans for the water and wastewater needs of the state's economically distressed areas, as well as agricultural water conservation funding and water-related research and planning grants

Agency/Entity Interest in the North Bosque Watershed: TWDB funds many water quality projects, including water and wastewater infrastructure, treatment, and planning. There are currently six wastewater treatment plants operating in the North Bosque Watershed. TWDB has provided funds for construction of new WWTPs as well as upgrades to existing plants. TWDB often serves in an advisory position on issues related to water quantity and quality.

Since 1980, the TWDB has provided funding through grants and loans for approximately 27 projects regarding water quality in the North Bosque Watershed.
