



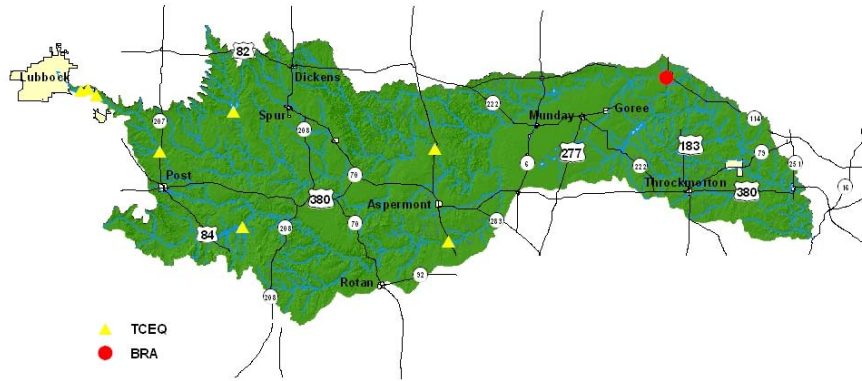

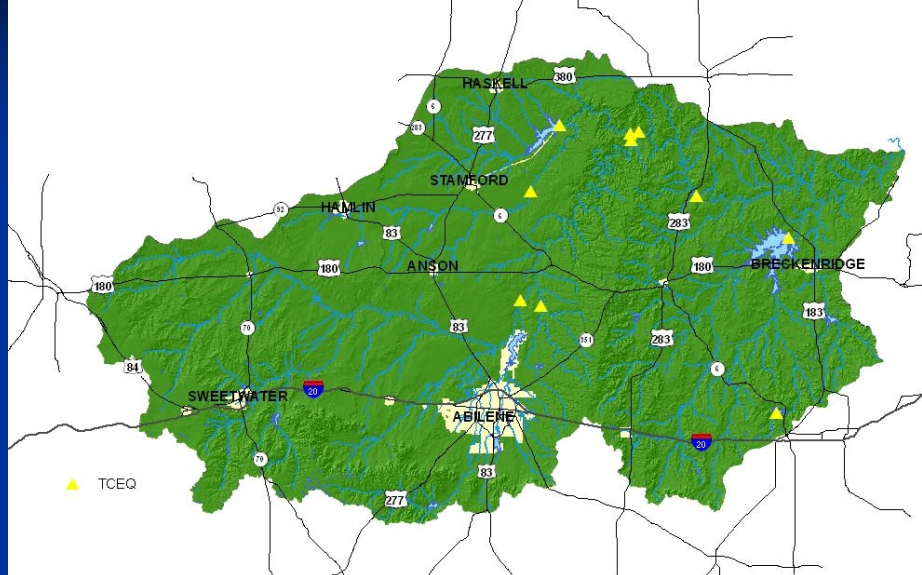
General Recommendations

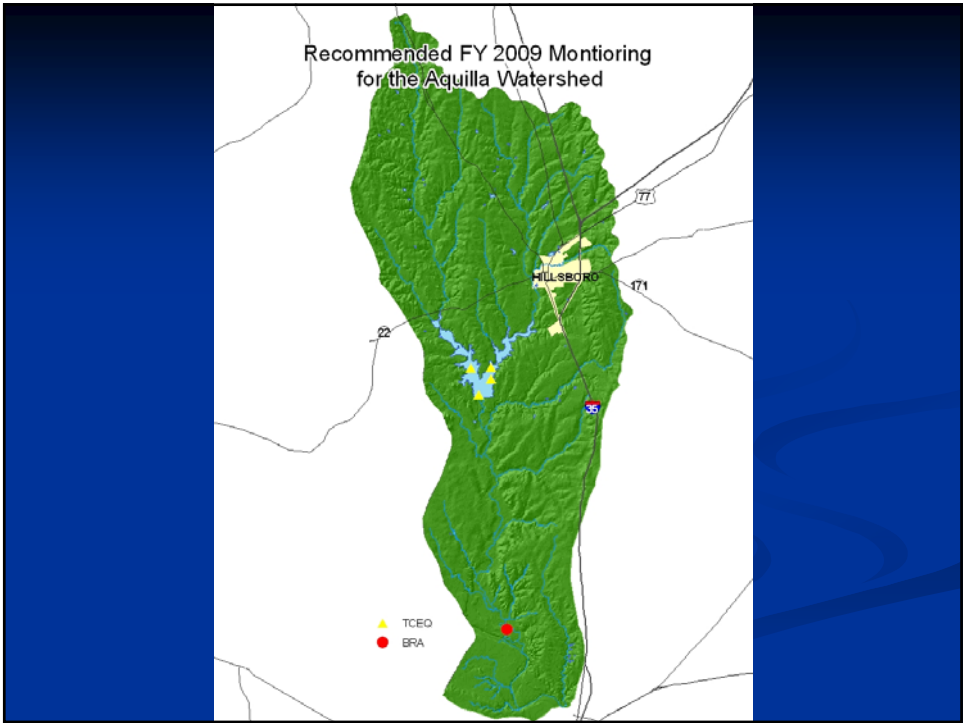
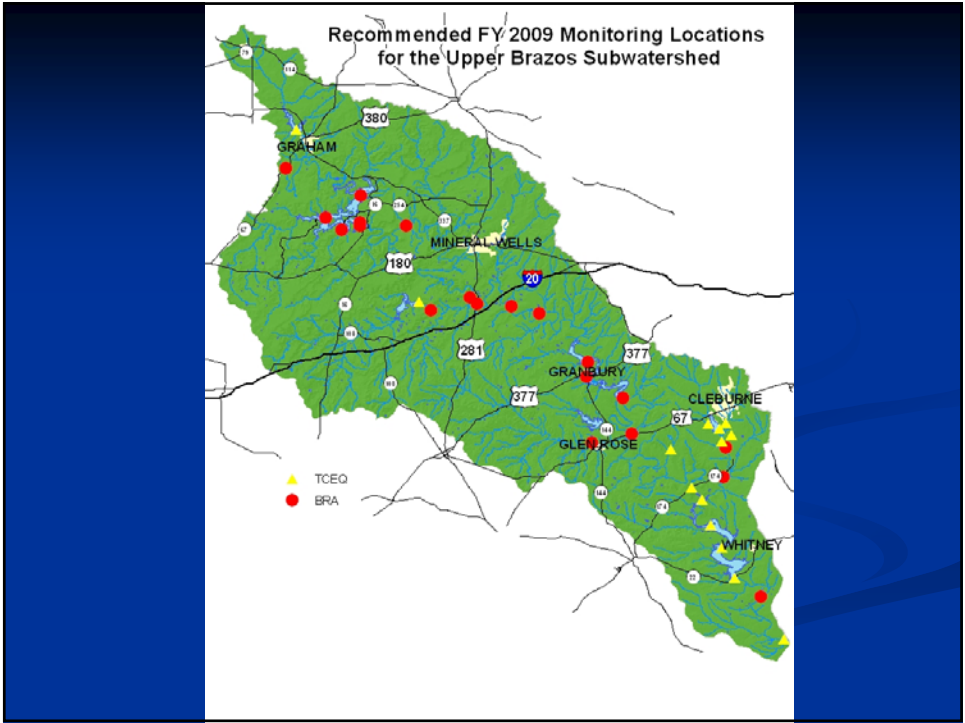
- Maintain existing monitoring levels in most watersheds
- Expand monitoring in Williamson County because it is experiencing rapid development in an ecologically sensitive area
- Reduce monitoring of small, rural streams where a baseline data set has been established per TCEQ Surface Water Quality Monitoring Team recommendations
- No new monitoring of small, rural streams until TCEQ Standards Work Group completes bacteria standards revisions, unless there is a compelling reason to do so
- Continue performing biological assessments to better characterize status of aquatic life in the basin
- Implement quarterly sampling on a 5-year rotating schedule to perform metals, VOC and SVOC monitoring on selected segments throughout the basin

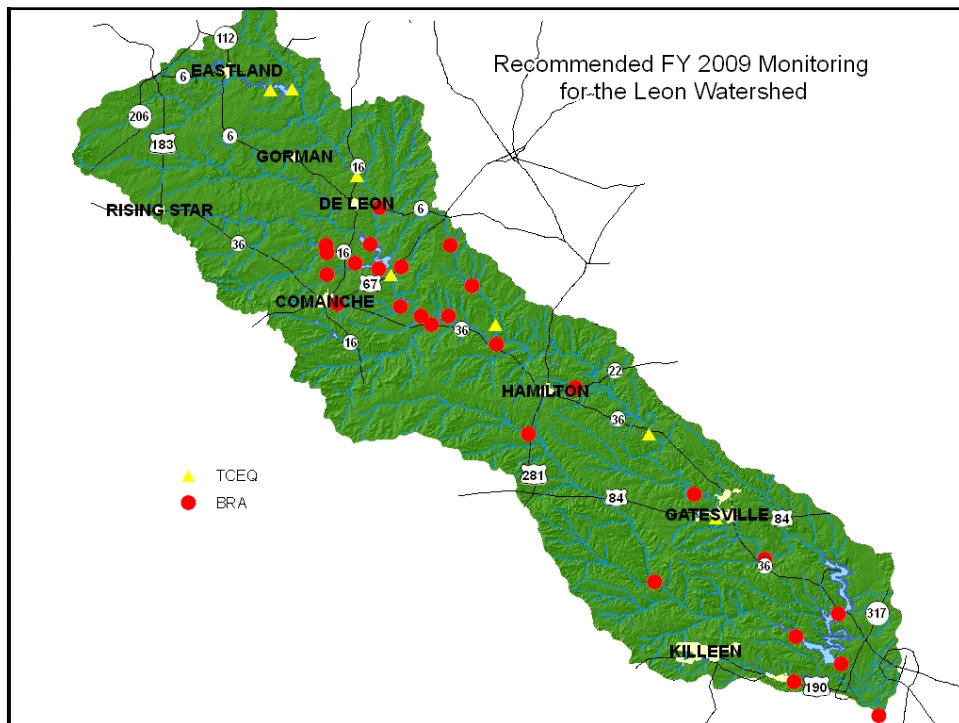
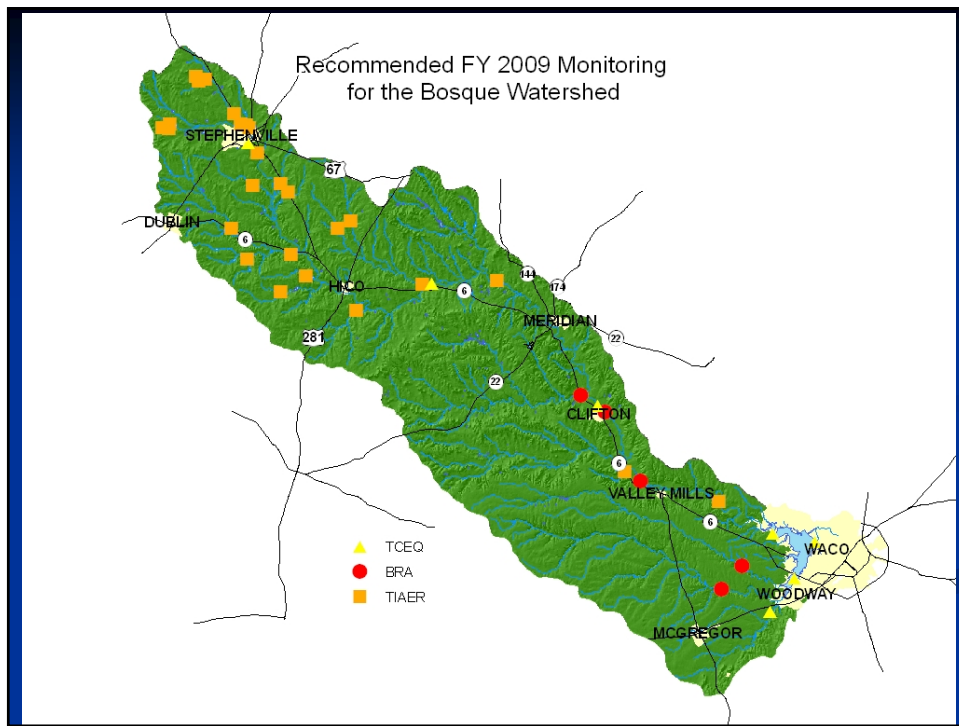
Recommended FY 2009 Monitoring Locations for the Salt Fork and Double Mountain Fork Subwatershed

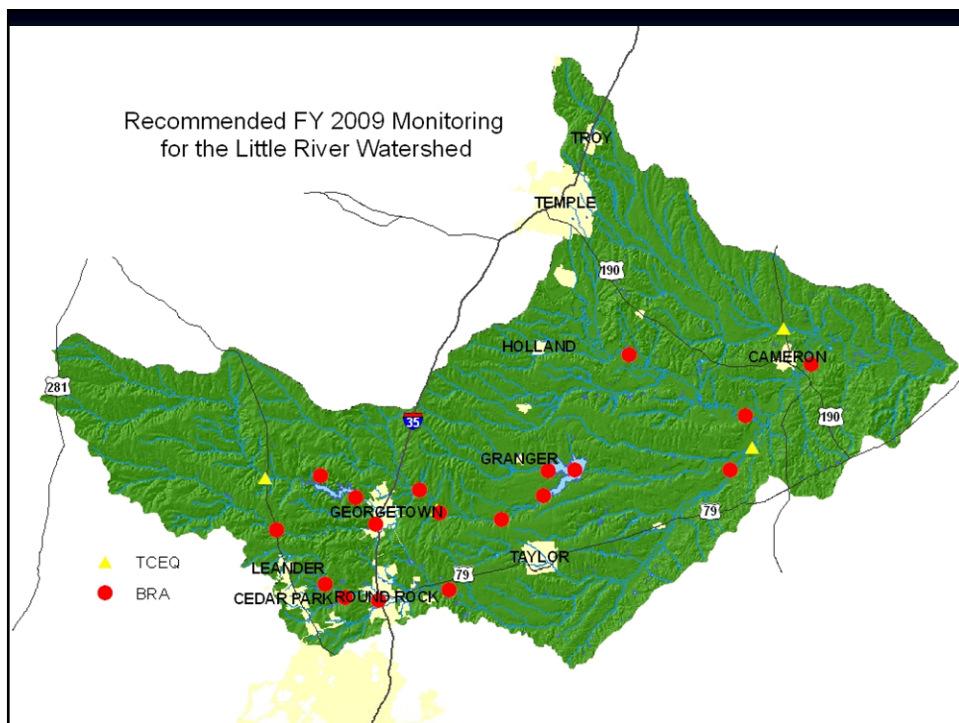
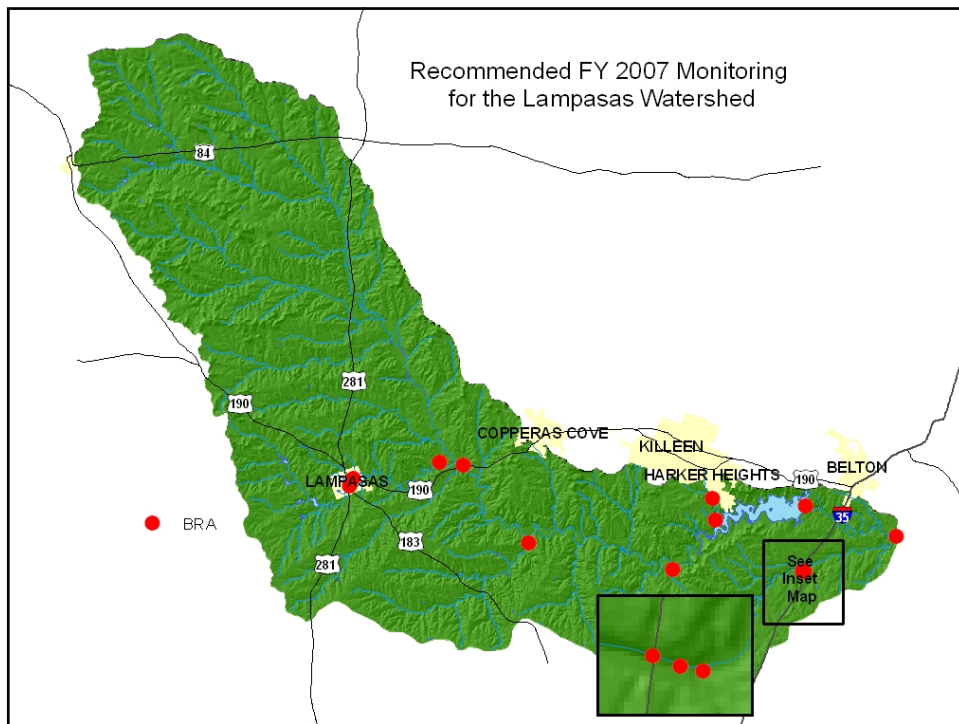


Recommended FY 2009 Monitoring Locations for the Clear Fork Subwatershed

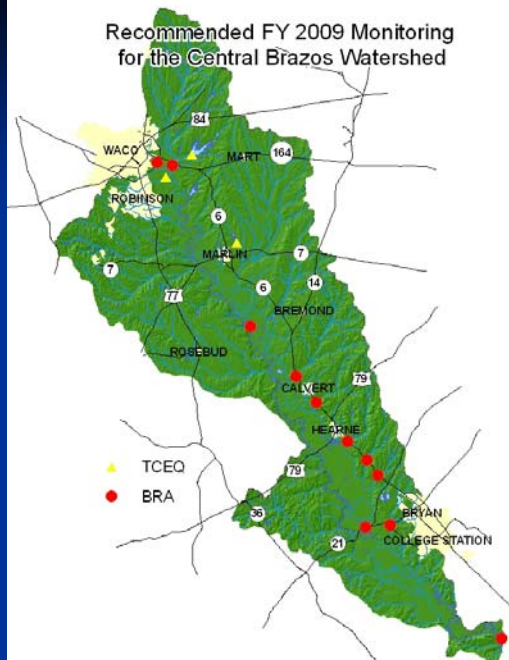








Recommended FY 2009 Monitoring
