Your entity was notified of a Stage 2 - Drought Warning declaration for the East Williamson County Regional Water System (EWCRWS) at Lake Granger on August 24, 2023, as a result of the total daily water consumption at the EWCRWS reaching ninety percent (90%) of the EWCRWS' production capacity for a period of 30 consecutive days. As specified in the Brazos River Authority (BRA) Drought Contingency Plan (Plan), this is one of the triggering criteria for a Stage 2 - Drought Warning Condition at the EWCRWS.

Over the last several weeks, there has been a significant reduction in total daily water consumption with treated water production averaging about 60 percent (60%) of the EWCRWS' production capacity. The reduced water consumption trend is expected to continue with the transition to Fall, cooler weather, and recent rainfall.

Therefore, BRA is rescinding the Stage 2 - Drought Warning declaration for the EWCRWS. However, the Stage 1 - Drought Watch Condition remains in effect for Lake Granger and the BRA water supply system of 11 reservoirs. Stage 1 - Drought Watch of the Plan is intended to provide awareness of the existing drought conditions and achieve a voluntary five percent (5%) reduction of the water use that would have occurred in the absence of any drought contingency measures.
