In accordance with its Drought Contingency Plan (Plan), the Brazos River Authority (BRA) informed you by letter of the declaration of the Stage 1 – Drought Watch for the BRA's Water Supply System (System) on August 11, 2022. Due to rainfall over the past several weeks, the combined storage capacity of the System of water supply reservoirs has risen above the Stage 1 trigger. The System includes the following reservoirs: Possum Kingdom, Granbury, Whitney, Aquilla, Proctor, Belton, Stillhouse Hollow, Georgetown, Granger, Limestone, and Somerville. We anticipate that the combined storage capacity will remain above the Stage 1 trigger level for an extended period.

As such, the BRA is terminating the Stage 1 – Drought Watch declaration for the System. A Stage 2 – Drought Warning condition remains in effect for Lake Belton and the Lake Stillhouse Hollow-Lake Georgetown Sub-system, and a Stage 4 – Pro Rata Curtailment condition remains in effect for Lake Proctor. In accordance with the Plan, all drought stages have been terminated for the remainder of the reservoirs in the System. If drought conditions re-emerge later this year, we will coordinate with you as necessary under the Plan.
