




Interlocal Agreement with the City of Georgetown for Joint Study of Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) in Williamson County

Need for the Project

- **High growth in Georgetown and Williamson County**
- **Expected water shortages by 2040 for the City of Georgetown and other parts of Williamson County**
- **ASR could help with BRA water supply from the East Williamson County Water Treatment System**
- **ASR could help the City with treatment capacity expansion and seasonal needs during peak demand**
- **Evaluation of ASR as a water supply strategy in Texas is increasing with several bills passed in the recent legislative session**



“BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the Brazos River Authority hereby authorizes the General Manager/CEO to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Georgetown to jointly study and fund an Aquifer Storage and Recovery Feasibility Study in Williamson County in an amount not to exceed \$165,000.”
