

PLAN AHEAD FOR 2011 BOATER EDUCATION COURSES

According to the U.S. Coast Guard, in 2009, 76 percent of all boating fatalities involved watercraft piloted by an operator that had not received boating safety training. The Brazos River Authority offers Boater Safety Courses at Lake Granbury and Possum Kingdom Lake throughout the spring and summer.



Though a boater safety course is not required by law for adults, boaters under the age of 18 are required by the Texas Water Safety Act to obtain certification to operate any type of personal watercraft, vessels with a motor exceeding 10 horse power and windblown vessels longer than 14 feet.

The course includes information on operating watercraft in all types of water conditions, from ponds to offshore and ideal situations to worst case scenarios. It is available for ages 12 and older, though children may not be certified until they are 13. Program cost is \$10 payable in cash only. Participants must provide a social security number and a picture identification card (driver's license, student I.D. or library card accepted).

Children younger than 16 must be accompanied by an adult. Classes begin at 8:30 a.m. and end about 4:30 p.m. Lunch is not provided; however, the class will break between noon and 1:30.
